

Salutation from the History Section

We have held two cemetery walks in White Cloud's Prospect Hill Cemetery. The first was on August 2, 2009 with a turn out of around 400 people. The second on was on September 8, 2019. For anyone who is not familiar with this event, volunteers are placed at specific spots in the cemetery and give a small presentation about the subject or lives of the people they are depicting. Careful research is done to make sure that information given is accurate. The cemetery walk is a way for people to learn and connect with the history of White Cloud and the surrounding area.

Those who were portrayed last time were: Mac Slade our White Cloud Eagle ball player prior the becoming the Indians by Herm Becker; Chief of Police Al Mendham by his son Bob; our Goat Man Wm McGogan, including his popcorn wagon, by Dave Wright; Margaret Mosher Stevens as a one room school teacher was done by Laureen Deaters; Medicine Man Big Elk by Gene Reid, World War II vet George (Billy) Martin by Chuck Christenson; Gas Station owner Andy Burke by his son Bob; Artist Alpheus Sidebotham by Eric LeMire; the Swedetown story was told by Sandy Westgate; and five generations of George Rosenberg's Hardware was represented by wife Dottie.









This year we are joining forces with Big Prairie/Everett Township Cemetery and plan on holding our event Sunday, September 12, 2021, at 2 in the afternoon, on the corner of 20th Street and S. Pine Street. We have selected our people and have begun the research. We will have Chuck Christenson as Doc Douglass; Laureen Deaters, playing Helen Dalziel, another one room school teacher, and Sandy Westgate doing the history of the Westgate family. We are looking for someone to play Martha Evans so if you are interested, please volunteer. Richard Dault will play a Catholic priest, Herm Becker will be the first Newaygo County Judge (Barton), Jan Smith will tell of Martha Gooch Utley who was the first person buried in the cemetery. Dave Wright will be telling the Crabtree's story which just leaves someone who is willing to tell the story of William Shorter, our civil war vet who was a member of the First Michigan Colored Regiment, later named the 102nd United States Colored Infantry.

We also are looking for someone willing to lend a couple of golf carts for handicapped persons who cannot make the trek. Stay tuned for more information.
